Forklift License Brampton - In North America, acquiring a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators could acquire a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

Forklifts are powered industrial trucks that come together with various options, like sit-down and stand-up. There are different sizes and types of forklift suitable for various industrial applications. Operator training programs are often individualized to be able deal with the certain types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck inside a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck within a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to focus on detailed course requirements but rather on the results of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common way for operators to receive their forklift license or certification. This method of certification requires the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machines within the workplace. Employers can choose to train staff on every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The program incorporates forklift operation methods, forklift maintenance, safety procedures and company rules. Topics specific to the worksite, like for example hazardous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and use every type of forklift on the worksite.

When using a third party trainer, the certification process will usually consist of an on-site component with hands-on practice.

It should be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Obtaining a lift truck license through employer-provided training allows the operator to operate a forklift for that employer only.

Forklift safety will always be an important factor of the forklift license training, even though the specifics of the safety training will be dependent upon the equipment being utilized. Some safety issues will vary for every employer and industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in offshore and marine uses.
